Dear Speaker Pelosi, Leader McCarthy, Chairman Nadler, and Ranking Member Jordan,

We write to express our support for S. 2174, the *Missing Persons and Unidentified Remains Act of 2019*. The tragedy of losing a loved one is compounded when there is no closure. By conducting thorough investigations, law enforcement agencies, working closely with our forensic science partners, play an important role in providing closure to the families and friends of crime victims. As such, it is critical that law enforcement be able to identify all victims of crime, including missing persons and unidentified remains.

The changes this legislation makes to existing grant programs will improve the ability of law enforcement and our forensic science partners to transport, process, identify, and share information on missing persons and unidentified remains. This legislation will provide grants directly to forensic science providers, which will help ensure they continue to receive the funding needed to carry out this work. The bill will also expand the grant's eligible uses of funds, which will allow forensic science providers to hire the necessary staff and purchase the equipment they require to support their efforts. These grants will be critical, especially considering the current budget environment facing many law enforcement agencies and forensic science organizations.
