Dear Sen. Cornyn,

I'm writing on behalf of the Major Cities Chiefs Association (MCCA) to register our support for S. 1569, the *Back the Blue Act of 2023*. The MCCA is a professional organization of law enforcement executives representing the largest cities in the United States and Canada.

Over the past few years, MCCA members have reported an increase in violent attacks against law enforcement officers. For example, during a six-month period last year, one MCCA member had eight officers shot in the line of duty. In another MCCA member agency, 37 shots were fired at officers during that time, but fortunately, only one officer was injured. The violence being directed toward America's brave law enforcement officers must stop immediately.

The *Back the Blue Act* includes several important protections for officers that will create a strong deterrent and help prevent future violence. For example, the legislation creates new federal crimes, with strict penalties, for killing or assaulting a law enforcement officer. S. 1569 also closes a loophole in the statute by making the killing or targeting of any, not just federal, law enforcement officer an aggravating factor in federal death penalty cases. Finally, the bill makes up to \$20 million in grant funding available to support efforts to improve the relationship between law enforcement agencies and the communities they serve.
