Dear Sen. Grassley, Sen. Feinstein, and Sen. Hassan,

I'm writing on behalf of the Major Cities Chiefs Association (MCCA) to register our support for S. 1475, the *Stop Pills That Kill Act*. The MCCA is a professional organization of law enforcement executives representing the largest cities in the United States and Canada.

Addressing the scourge of synthetic opioids, like illicitly manufactured fentanyl and fentanyl-related substances (FRS), is a top priority for the MCCA. Recently, there has been a significant uptick in counterfeit prescription pills laced with fentanyl, FRS, or methamphetamine. These pills are widely accessible as criminal drug networks sell them direct to consumers via social media or e-commerce platforms. S. 1475 will enhance law enforcement's ability to mitigate this threat. The legislation requires the DEA to develop and implement a response plan to address counterfeit fentanyl substances. It also updates existing drug enforcement statutes and adds a statutory definition for counterfeit fentanyl substances. These provisions will help ensure that the criminal drug networks manufacturing, distributing, and selling counterfeit pills can be held accountable.
