Dear Rep. Krishnamoorthi, Rep. Meng, Rep. Velázquez, and Sen. Gillibrand,

I'm writing on behalf of the Major Cities Chiefs Association (MCCA) to register our support for H.R. 4172/S. 2030, the *Hate Crimes Commission Act of 2023*. The MCCA is a professional organization of law enforcement executives representing the largest cities in the United States and Canada.

According to the most recently available FBI data, there were 12,411 hate crime offenses reported in 2021. However, hate crimes are often grossly underreported, so the actual number of offenses that were committed is likely significantly higher. Furthermore, the rise in hate crimes has disproportionately impacted major cities. A recent study by the Center for the Study of Hate and Extremism at Cal State San Bernadino found that, in 2021, hate crimes rose roughly 39% in 37 major cities and 54.5% in the ten largest cities.² This trend, unfortunately, continued throughout 2022.

Addressing the rise in hate crimes is a priority for MCCA member agencies. The *Hate* Crimes Commission Act of 2023 will create a U.S. Commission on Hate Crimes, and the Commission's efforts will improve law enforcement's ability to prevent and respond to hate crimes. For example, hate crimes are often underreported, and the Commission's recommendations may help address this challenge. In addition, the Commission's evaluation of community bias prevention initiatives may assist with developing alternative responses to assist victims. As the Commission carries out its work, ensuring law enforcement is adequately represented is critical, especially considering its important role in addressing hate crimes.
